Cold Weather is Approaching

As you know, winter weather is approaching. We ask that you take the following precautions to help reduce the potential for personal injuries as well as damage to property.

- Be aware of your surroundings and use caution whether you are walking or driving.
- Watch for "black ice"-an area of pavement that only looks wet but has a fine layer of ice on it. Remember, areas that have been cleared can thaw and refreeze. Report any slick or problem areas to management.
- Frozen water lines can do more than just be an inconvenience. They can cause extreme stress on pipe material and cause them to burst which can cause flooding and damage. Help keep pipes from freezing by using some of the following tips.
- Keep your house warm. The temperature should be at least 65 degrees. The temperature inside the walls where the pipes are located is much colder than the walls themselves. Do not turn off your heat when away!
- Open the cabinet doors under your sinks to expose warm air to your pipes and supply lines.
- Turn on faucets to allow a slow drip but make sure that your drains are functioning properly (i.e.; are not clogged) before leaving water running. If you experience any malfunction, please submit a work order promptly.
- Notify us immediately if you notice a substantial drop in pressure or a complete loss of water at any of your faucets or toilets. This could mean you have a frozen pipe.
